Opening of the Conference



Kairat Kelimbetov, Governor of the Astana International Financial Centre

Mr. Kelimbetov was appointed AIFC Governor by Order of the President of Kazakhstan on 24 December 2015. He heads the AIFC and is a member of the AIFC Management Council.

From 2013 to 2015 Mr. Kelimbetov was Governor of the National Bank of Kazakhstan. Between 2012 and 2013, as Deputy Prime Minister of Kazakhstan, he was responsible for macroeconomics, fiscal policy, state assets management and financial sector, as well as tax and customs policy, and was Chairman of the Council of the Eurasian Economic Commission, representing Kazakhstan. In 2011 he held the position of Minister of Economic Development and Trade of Kazakhstan.

From 2008 to 2011 Mr. Kelimbetov was Head of the Samruk-Kazyna National Welfare Fund which manages all of Kazakhstan's state-owned assets. Prior to this appointment, he held the positions of Presidential Chief of Staff, Head of the Kazyna Sustainable Development Fund and Minister of Economy and Budget Planning. Previously, Mr. Kelimbetov was a member of Kazakhstan's Presidential Supreme Economic Council, Head of Kazakhstan's Agency for Strategic Planning and First Vice-Minister of Finance.

Mr. Kelimbetov is a graduate of the Lomonosov Moscow State University, the National Higher School of Public Administration under the President of Kazakhstan, and Georgetown University (USA).

Over the years, he served as Chairman of the Constitutional Council of the Republic of Kazakhstan, Deputy Head of the Administration of the President of the Republic of Kazakhstan, Minister of Justice of the Republic of Kazakhstan, Advisor to the President of the Republic of Kazakhstan, Deputy Chairman of the Constitutional Court of the Republic of Kazakhstan.

He is a member of the European Commission for Democracy through Law (Venice Commission) from the Republic of Kazakhstan, Deputy Chairman of the International Union of Lawyers, Chairman of the Commission on Clemency under the President of the Republic of Kazakhstan, Honorary President of the Kazakhstan Criminological Association and Chairman of the Public Council for Combating Corruption. The Future of Law



Mark Beer OBE, Chairman of the AIFC LawTech Advisory Council

Mark is Chairman of the Metis Institute, which advises Governments and Judiciaries on economic diversification through enhancement of the rule of law and effective justice; co-Founder of the Deep Tech Dispute Resolution Lab at Oxford University; a visiting fellow at Oxford University; and a member of the World Economic Forum's Global Expert Network. He is also the Immediate Past President of the International Association for Court Administration; Chairman of the Board of Trustees of the Global Legal Action Network; a member of the Commercial Dispute Resolution Taskforce, part of the UK Government's 'LawTech Delivery Panel'; a visiting professor at the Shanghai University for Political Science and Law; advisor to the Boards of Resolve Disputes Online, Jur.io and Pheonix Advisors; a member of The Innovation Working Group of the Task Force on Justice focussed on addressing UN SDG 16.3; a Professional Associate with Outer Temple Chambers; and a member of the International Council of the Supreme Court of the Republic of Kazakhstan.

Mark also works with Ministries, Judiciaries and NGOs on rule of law initiatives, particularly on the use of technology to enhance access to justice. He is a speaker and lecturer about LawTech; the future of law, commerce and dispute resolution (with a particular focus on blockchain, smart contracts, virtual assets and crypto-enforcement); and the implications and legal issues surrounding China's Belt and Road Initiative, having addressed Governments, Universities, Research Centres and the Private Sector in, among other places, China, Europe, the Middle East and Europe.

Mark advises Governments, law firms, in-house legal teams, international financial centres and dispute resolution authorities about the future of law and justice, and their implications for strategy, innovation, modelling, workflows and client servicing. Mark also advises on legislative reform, and the mechanisms to deliver citizen-centric dispute resolution for all.



Joseph Lee, Member of the AIFC Legal Tech Advisory Council, senior lecturer in law at Exeter Law School.

Dr Joseph Lee is a senior lecturer in law at Exeter Law School. He joined the School as lecturer in company and commercial law in October 2012. From 2006 to 2012 he was lecturer in business law at the University of Nottingham, which he joined immediately after the completion of his PhD at the University of London. Joseph has also been visiting professor and collaborateur scientifiqueat the University of Liège, Belgium, and visiting professor at the National Taiwan University teaching UK and EU company law and English commercial law.

He was visiting scholar at the Graduate Schools for Law and Politics, University of Tokyo in 2014. He has lectured at the National Chiao-Tung University of Taiwan, University of Hong Kong, Kyushu University and Nagoya University of Japan, and Bocconi University.

Joseph specialises in company law & governance, financial markets regulation, commercial law, and arbitration. He teaches financial markets law and regulation, corporate law and governance, and international trade law.

His research interests are in the areas of distributed ledgers technologies (DLTs) and smart technologies in financial markets, regulation and supervision of financial market infrastructures (FMI), Online dispute resolution and automated enforcement, and data trusts and governance. He welcomes PhD applications for research supervision in these subject areas.

Joseph regularly acts as a consultant. He advised a central bank and government agencies and provides training to the judiciary. He is fellow of the European Law Institute and a member of the International Bar Association. Joseph currently holds a research grant awarded by the UK Economic and Social Research Council (ESRC-IAA) to investigate into Artificial Intelligence (AI) in capital markets

Dr Mimi Zou is the inaugural Fangda Career Development Fellow in Chinese Commercial Law at St Hugh's College, in association with the Oxford Law Faculty and the Oxford China Centre. It is the first post in Chinese law at the University of Oxford. Dr Zou has the role of developing the subject as a new field of study and research at Oxford, exploring how best to understand Chinese law and the links between law, economy, politics, and society, both within China and as it affects transnational relations.

Dr Zou also gives tutorials in the BA in Jurisprudence programme for undergraduate students at St Hugh's College. She is the co-founder of the Deep Tech Dispute Resolution Lab, which aims to build an internationally leading hub of interdisciplinary and multi-stakeholder research cooperation on the study of deep technologies in dispute resolution.

Dr Zou's main areas of expertise are in Chinese and comparative contract law, employment law, law and technology, and commercial dispute resolution, with over 60 publications in international journals, books, and professional magazines. She is a member of the World Economic Forum Experts Network.

Dr Zou obtained her Doctor of Philosophy in Law and Bachelor of Civil Law (Distinction) degrees from St John's College and Christ Church, the University of Oxford on a Commonwealth Scholarship and a James Fairfax Oxford Australia Scholarship. She also graduated with first class honours degrees in Law, Economics, and Social Sciences (University Medal) from the University of Sydney. She is currently completing an Executive MBA programme. Dr Zou has been admitted as a lawyer in the state of New South Wales (Australia) and a solicitor of England and Wales. She has also been called to the Bar of England and Wales.

Prior to her appointment at Oxford, Dr Zou was Edwards Fellow at Columbia Law School, Assistant Professor at the Chinese University of Hong Kong, and Senior Researcher at Utrecht University. Dr Zou has also been a visitor at a number of leading Chinese universities and research institutes, including the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences, Renmin University, Tsinghua University, Peking University, China University of Political Science and Law, Zhejiang University, and Southwest University of Political Science and Law.

Dr Zou has worked or served as an adviser and consultant for international organisations, government departments, and firms in tech and professional services sectors in China, Europe, USA, and Australasia for over 15 years. She provides training on China-related legal, economic, cultural, and strategic issues for senior civil servants, diplomats, officers of the armed forces, lawyers, and business professionals around the world. She is currently a special adviser to the Great Britain China Centre, a non-departmental public body set up by the Foreign & Commonwealth Office (FCO).
