- "(i) the employer is more likely to have the means to compensate the victim than the employee and can be expected to have insured against the liability;
- (ii) the tort would have been committed as a result of activity being taken by the employee on behalf of the employer;
- (iii) the employee's activity is likely to be part of the business activity of the employer;
- (iv)the employer by employing the employee to carry out the activity would have created the risk of the tort committed by the employee;
- (v)the employee will, to a greater or lesser extent, have been under the control of the employer."
