ADVANTAGES OF DOING BUSINESS IN THE AIFC



REGULATORY ENVIRONMENT

AIFC operates under a separate regulatory regime from Kazakhstan, which is based on principles of English common law and provides a more flexible and businessfriendly environment for companies



ACCESS TO GLOBAL MARKETS

Through its own stock exchange and regulatory framework that adheres to international standards, the AIFC presents a pathway to global markets, granting greater accessibility to financial institutions and investors worldwide



SPECIAL VISA AND FOREIGN LABOR REGIME

The AIFC provides visa-free entry to foreign nationals employed by companies registered within the Centre, as well as to their family members

BECOMING AN AIFC PARTICIPANT

STEP 1.

Determine how you wish to establish the legal entity

To become an AIFC Participant you may either:

01. Incorporate a new entity in the AIFC

02. Register a Foreign Company/Partnership incorporated in any jurisdiction other than the AIFC as a Recognised Company or Recognised Partnership

03. Redomicile legal entity incorporated in another jurisdiction








STEP 2.

Determine the nature of the business activity of your legal entity

REGULATED BUSINESS

If your legal entity will be engaged in regulated activities, it must apply for authorisation from the AIFC Regulator (AFSA).

Activities that require authorisation include (follow the links below to learn more):



NON-REGULATED BUSINESS

If the legal entity is not engaged in any regulated activities, the authorisation process is not required, and applicants can immediately proceed to the registration process





STEP 3.

Select the type of your legal entity

The AIFC regulation provides various forms of legal entities to cater to the diverse business requirements of its participants, in line with global best practices. The available options include:

- Private Company
- Public Company
- Special Purpose Company
- General Partnership
- Limited Partnership
- Limited Liability Partnership
- Non-profit Incorporated Organization
- Foundation
- Investment Company
- Recognised Partnership
- Recognised General Partnership
- Recognised Limited Partnership
- Recognised Limited Liability Partnership





STEP 4.

Check the general requirements for all legal entities

CEO must have an Individual Identification Number (IIN).

In case if proposed CEO is a foreign citizen, the IIN can be obtained via the <u>AIFC Expat Centre</u>.

Please, book the time one day prior to the planned visit.



A company (exceptions apply to Special Purpose Company) must have at all times a registered office to which all communications and notices may be addressed. It must be located within the AIFC territory in Astana city.

The AIFC territory is set in accordance with the Decree of the President of the Republic of Kazakhstan 'On determining the boundaries of the territory of the International Financial Center "Astana", dated December 31, 2015, No. 161.

STEP 5.

Proceed to the registration

Registration of a legal entity may be conducted either online through the digitalresident.kz or offline by submitting applications by post or e-mail

FOR ONLINE REGISTRATION

Open the e-Residence 01 Portal digitalresident.kz 02. Login or create your account 03. Create a new application for registration 04. Choose an organizational-legal form 05. Fill out an application 06. Make a payment 07. Submit an application







FOR OFFLINE REGISTRATION

Please fill out application forms relevant to your legal entity type, pay the registration fee (please contact registration@afsa.kz for the invoice), and submit your application via post or email (registration@afsa.kz)



Please find applicable forms here.

After the application submission, the Office of the Registrar of companies will assess your application. Please note that any additional information may be required during the assesment.

Once the application comply with all requirements, the Certificate of Incorporation will be generated.





WHAT'S NEXT?

After the legal entity is registered, it can start conducting its business operations, while its directors are obliged to comply with the regulations and enabling rules prescribed by the AIFC.

It is important to note that AIFC Participants must provide specific information periodically (such as annual filings) or when changes occur in their registered details (as event-driven notification).
